The Oregon State Open Fiddle Contest has been going strong for 58 years. It's fun to watch and an important part of Oregon's fiddling history. Best of all, anyone who plays the fiddle can join in—no matter your age or abilities. So, should you compete? Absolutely. It's helpful to know that contests are not all about how well you play or the prizes. Here are 5 reasons you should enter no matter your playing level:

- **1. Improving your playing.** Competing in contests pushes you to practice and polish your skills. Preparation for a contest will significantly advance the tunes you're already playing. Personally, my most memorable contests were not the ones in which I placed highest, but the ones in which I played my best. There's no better feeling!
- **2. Performance experience.** Contests give you stage time, which helps build confidence and stage presence. The more contests you enter, the less scary it becomes.

3. New friendships. You will meet fiddlers of all ages and skill

levels. Over time, many of these people will likely become your friends as you attend multiple contests and see them throughout the year.

- **4. Great fiddling.** You'll get up close to some of the finest fiddlers around. For example, our judges this year are accomplished musicians with years of contest fiddling experience and state and national wins. (Don't miss the judges' show near the end of the evening at the contest!)
- **5. Supporting fiddling and fiddlers**. As a contestant, you're part of a historic tradition and helping to keep it going! You support fiddling any time you participate in a contest, and also by cheering on other players.

HOEDOWNER Tune of the Month

I first learned this tune after listening to a workshop with Alan Jabbour in the 1970s. It was Alan who recorded this tune from the Virginia fiddler Henry Reed which was archived in 1966. Apparently the tune dates back to the 1800s and was often played as a reel. Another tune is named Ducks on the Millpond, and both of these tunes have intermingled over the years. My transcription is based on slowing it down somewhat to create a contemplative feeling that emphasizes the mixolydian mode feeling. Other fiddlers do the same slower tempo, while others play it in reel tempo. ~ David Altman




Bill & Pat Winfrey had their prayers answered


