OLD TIME FIDDLE CONTEST AT CLARK COLLEGE

The first annual Northwest Fiddle Contest and Exhibition will be held at Clark College, Vancouver, Washington, on Friday, February 13th and Saturday, February 14th.

The contest will begin at noon on Saturday, Feb. 14. The rules will be similar to those used at the National Old Time Fiddle Contest at Weiser, Idaho. There will be three divisions——open (\$5.00 registration fee), junior (18 and under, \$3.00 registration fee), and senior (65 and over, \$3.00 registration fee). There will be \$600.00 in trophies and cash prizes. First prize will be \$100.00 and there will be a \$25.00 prize to the contestant travelling the greatest distance to attend the contest. The judges will be Vivian Williams, Scattle, Washington, Bill Yohey, McMinne-ville, Oregon and Marshall Jackson, Gresham, Oregon. Jim Calvert of Puyallup, Washington will be Master of Ceremonies at the contest.

The Tall Timber String Band from Seattle will perform in concert Friday, February 13 at 8:30 p.m. Tall Timber features champion fiddlers Vivian Williams and Barbara Lamb playing many of the twin fiddling selections featured on their new album Twin Sisters. Arthur Billingsley, a musical saw player from Pine Bluff, Arkansas will also appear on the program.

All events will be held in Gaiser Hall on the Clark College Campus.

Admission: Adults, \$2.50 both days, \$1.75 one day. Children \$1.00 both days, \$0.50 one day. Clark College students, free.
