# OREGON OLDTIME FIDDLERS ASSOCIATION

### OFFICIAL STATE CONTEST RULES

- Participants in the Oregon Oldtime Fiddling Contest shall:
  - A. Have resided in Oregon permanently for six (6) months prior to the contest date.
  - B. Hold a current valid individual COTFA membership card for a six (6) month period prior to the contest date.
  - C. Qualify for competition by payment of entry fee as established by Contest Chairman and may play in one division only.
- At registration, all contestants shall draw for initial order of appearance for the first preliminary round. Contest Chairman in further rounds will draw before each round for new order of appearance.
- 3. Contestants at each appearance must first play a hoedown, second a waltz, and third a tune of their choice other than a hoedown or waltz. No tune shall be played more than once during all appearances of a contestant. Suggested total playing time is four (4) minutes. Points will be deducted if playing becomes monotonous or repetitious.
- 4. Contestants may play without accompanist or with no more than two.
- 5. Any danceable folk tunes played in Oldtime Fiddle fashion are acceptable.
- Contact microphones and amplified instruments will not be permitted.
- 7. No trick or fancy fiddling will be allowed during the contesting appearances.
- 8. Judging will be scored for Oldtime Fiddling Ability, Rhythm or Timing, and Tone Quality. All scores will be accumulative. Points will be deducted for any violations of the above rules #3 through #7, inclusive.
- 9. Any protest must be submitted to the Contest Chairman and signed by not less than three contestants of the contest involved within three (3) hours of the protest occurrence.
- 10. Judges will be selected by the Contest Committee and will number either three (3) or five (5) at the discretion of the committee.
- 11. All decisions of the Judges and of the Contest Committee will be final.
- 12. All other considerations, such as payment of registration fee at the National Contest and determinations regarding residency and eligibility will be made at the discretion of the Eoard of Directors of OOTFA.

# CONTEST TULES BLUE MOUNTIAN OLDTIME FIDDLERS ASSOCIATION (REVISED 1980 EDITION)

CHAMPIONSHIP DIVISION - Any contestant placing in the top Five of any division of any Regional or State Contest or the top Thirty of any division of a National Contest within the last Five years Must play in the Championship Division. Except Juniors and Seniors may Choose t play in the Championship Division.

OPEN DIVISION - Any contestant who Doesn't qualify for any of the other divisions. (See Intermediate and Championship rules.)

### INTERMEDIATE DIVISION

- 1. A contestant who has never played in a Contest Must play in the Open Division before contestant can be eligible to play in the Intermediate Division, unless the contestant has had a hearing before Three Officers of the Blue Mountain Oldtime Fiddlers Association, before the Contest begins. The Officers will classify the contestant for a suitable division.
- 2. An Intermediate Fiddler who wins first in one Intermediate contest shall play in the Open Division one time before they can compete in the Intermediate Divisian again.
- 2a. If an Intermediate Fiddler should place Fifth or better in the Open division, the Contestant will be eliminated from the Intermediate competition.
- 3. An Intermediate contestant who wins in TWO Intermediate Contest in one year will be out of the Intermediate competition.
- 4. Any contestant placing in <u>any</u> finals of <u>any</u> division of any Regional, State or National Cotest cannot compete in any Intermediate Contest.
- 5. <u>Intermediate Board</u> will consist of the present <u>Board of Directors</u> of the Blue Mountain Oldtime Fiddlers Association.

JUNIOR DIVISION - The contestant <u>must</u> be 17 years or younger. If only one contestant qualifies for the Championship Division, that contestant <u>must</u> play in that Division. (See Championship Rules.)

SENIOR DIVISION - The contestant <u>must</u> be 65 years or older. If the Senior contestant qualifies for the Championship Division, that contestant <u>must</u> play in that Division. (See Championship Division Rules.)

### MISCELLANEOUS RULES -

- 1. Tunes are to be played in the following order; A. Waltz; B. Hoe Down, C. Tune of choice other than a waltz or a hoe down.
- 2. No rags allowed.
- 3. No trick or fancy fiddling allowed during the contesting appearances.
- 4. No cross tuning on stage.

### ALL RULES WILL BE COMPLIED WITH!!

- 5. There will be no Electric Instruments Allowed.
- 6. Time Limit for playing three tunes will be at the discretion of Director.

### DIVISION RULES

## Championship Division

- Includes contestants eighteen (18) years old and less than sixty-five (65) who have placed as follows:
  - In top twenty (20) of Championship Division at Weiser.
  - In top three (3) of Ladies Division at Weiser or Certified Regional Contest.
  - In top five (5) of any State Championship Division.
  - (3) In top five (5) of any state championship between (4) Any other contestant who qualifies by age and who feels qualified, may enter the Championship Division.

Exception: Any person placing first in the Intermediate Division of the Oregon State Contest must compete in the Championship thereafter. If such contestant does not make the first elimination in the Championship Division at the State Contest two years in a row, he may drop back to Intermediate Division competition the following (or third) year.

- b. Contestants who participate in the Championship Division shall be expected to actively participate at fiddling functions during the year including fairs, shows and the state convention.
- The first place winner in the Championship Division will be expected to represent the OOTFA at the National Contest at Weiser, Idaho in June. In the event that the reigning champion establishes residency in another state, or for other reasons cannot represent the OOTFA during the year in the State of Oregon or at the National Contest, a Reserve Champion will be selected by the Board of Directors as a substitute. This Reserve Champion will be the second place winner in the Championship Division. Should the Reserve Champion not be able to attend, then a Reserve Champion will be selected in top order of placement in the Championship Division at the State Contest.

#### Intermediate Division

- Includes all contestants eighteen (18) years old to sixty-five (65).
- Includes all contestants not qualifying for Championship Division.

# STANDING RULES (Page 2)

- C. Senior Division
  - a. Includes all contestants sixty-five (65) years of age or older.
- D. Junior Division
  - Includes all contestants under eighteen (18)
     years of age and not qualifying for Junior-Junior Division.
- E. Junior-Junior Division
  - Includes all contestants under thirteen (13) years of age.


