



OREGON OLD TIME FIDDLERS STATE CHAMPIONSHIP CONTEST

Questions people are asking:

WHO MAY ENTER THE CONTEST? Any fiddler who is a member of the Oregon Old time Fiddlers Association may enter providing he or she has lived the previous six months in Oregon. Except the Twin Fiddle contest - one player may be from out of state.

HOW LONG DO YOU HAVE TO BE A MEMBER? Our standing rules allow a contestant to join the day of the contest if he or she is not already a member.

WHAT ARE THE DIVISIONS? Pee Wee - 8 years and younger, Jr. Jr. 9 thru 12, Junior - 13 thru 17, Young Adult - 18 thru 36, Adult - 37 thru 59; Senior - 60 thru 69; Sr. Sr. - 70 and older. The OPEN division is open to all ages.

WHAT DIVISIONS MAY A CONTESTANT ENTER? The division for his or her age group and the Twin Fiddle Contest.

Complete rules will be available at the contest.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO ENTER THE CONTEST: Nothing, nothing, nothing.

HOW DO I GET TO THE CONTEST? Take exit 256/Market St. Exit - go east on Market - away from downtown - to Lancaster. Turn left (north) onto Lancaster and go to building 50 (the gym) on the edge of the Chemeketa Community College Campus which is approximately 2 miles from Market St. After you cross over the Silverton Highway, the contest site is less than a half mile down Lancaster. There is a big 50 on the side of the gym. Also, at the entrance there is a sign -- Winema Place. If you get to the light and the main entrance to Chemeketa, you have gone too far. Turn into the entrance and follow the street around to the right and you will end up at the gym.

SALEM INN The Salem Inn is donating a complimentary room to the association and gave us a good price through their bid. It is located on the west side of I-5 at the Market St. exit (Exit 256). It stands out on the north side of Market as you leave I-5 and start towards downtown. If you stay at the Salem Inn, please tell them that you are with the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers. The rooms are listed under the name of "Lew Holt" - please refer to that name when making reservations so our association will receive the appropriate recognition.

RV PARKING: We thought we had everything under control but we have run into a little snag with RV parking. We can not get into the parking lot as soon as we thought we might. At this time there will be no RV

parking Thursday night and not on Friday until late that afternoon. So what do we do? We are working on an area near by where we can gather until we can park. Please contact Lew Holt if you plan to bring an RV and he will either mail you the RV parking plans or perhaps can tell you on the phone.



You will need to call before the 14th. Our security will have a trailer at the gym Friday to give you instructions where to park if you haven't contacted Lew. The college people are bending over backwards to help us. We are sorry for this inconvenience but the best of plans of mice and men are sometimes changed.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON JAM We are planning a Friday afternoon jam as we had last year during the contest. All fiddlers are invited to sign up for the jam much as we did Thursday night at the convention or a lot like any Sunday jam. You need not be a contestant.

We do have some "don'ts" and "do's" that we need to talk about. Friday during the day we are sharing the facilities with those that use the facilities everyday. So, gang, no playing fiddle music in the hall until they go home about 4:30. We have a large room for practice so let's keep our noise/music in there. Please don't ask to use their phones. There are day care classes, high school classes, offices - all kinds of activities that we need to work around. We are so appreciative and thankful that they let us in on Friday so we don't want to jeopardize our visit.

Please don't park on the east side of the gym during the day on Friday. This is the parking area for the staff and students. Then late that afternoon we want to reserve that area for the Rvs. MANY PARKING SPOTS ARE MARKED "HANDICAPPED PARKING ONLY." WE ARE WARNED THAT THESE AREAS ARE PATROLLED 24 HOURS A DAY AND ARE TICKETED IF YOU DO NOT HAVE THE HANDICAP STICKER.

The Blue Moon Restaurant is staying open "just for us" Friday evening and all day Saturday and evening. You are encouraged to patronize the restaurant. We are very fortunate to have this arrangement. Why don't you thank them for staying open for us. Like Roger says, they serve some mighty good food.
