Ann lost her concentration and her place in the song but charged ahead unabashed and almost unstoppable!!

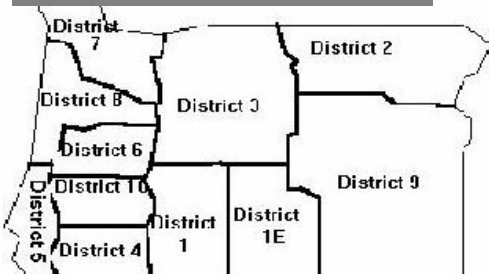
At the membership

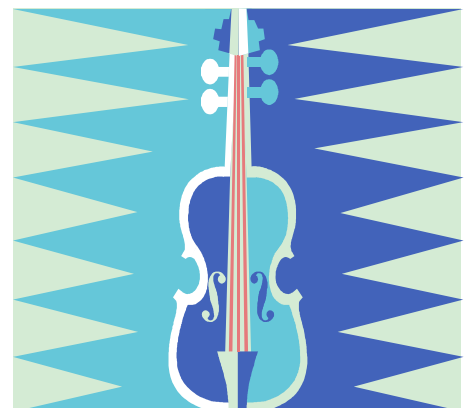
