2025 OOTFA Membership Dues

At the June OOTFA Board Meeting in Burns, the decision was made to set the 2025 dues after hearing the postage studies over the past year. here is what was decided:

There are two parts to our Membership fees:

- 1. Dues: The board decided that the 2025 dues would remain the same at \$35.
- 2. Hoedowner Delivery Charges: After evaluating the cost of the Hoedowner and with mail costs increasing, an increase of \$10 for the Mailed Hoedowner, from \$5 to \$15, was approved.



The Intermediate Fiddle Class (1st Saturday of month) remains cancelled for the summer. Hopefully it will return in the Fall.

The Basic Fiddle Class (2nd Monday of month) was attended by 15 people. Donna O'Neil led the group through some warm up tunes by ear, a review of 3 tunes from last month, and a half dozen or so new tunes. Multiple playing's at different tempos ensured all a good learning experience. Linda Danielson demonstrated some simple and more complex ways of playing some of these tunes, and added some historical context to several of them.

The July Central Grange Jam (2nd Saturday of the month) had about a dozen people attend. Fewer than usual due to the heat, avoiding the traffic for the Oregon Country Fair, and several members performing at the Lavender Festival up the McKenzie River. But this dozen made good, fun music with guitar, bass, fiddle, banjo, and singing.

Sunshine, lavender fragrance, and music wafted through the air upriver at the Lavender Festival in Leaburg on Saturday, July 13th. 
